Public Discussion and Committee Reports:

Thank you note was read from the Algona Public Library by Don McGregor.

Discussion was held on the Table-Top Discussion to be held by Home Land Security.

Maureen Elbert requested an invoice from NIACOG for the Housing Needs Assessment and Iowa Workforce Development for the Labor Shed Survey. Maureen has some utilities that are willing to give dollars toward these two projects after July 1, 2003. KCEDC invited Supervisors to Kossuth County CEO Business and Industry Networking Meeting on Wednesday, June 25th with Dr. Robert Koob, President of the University of Northern Iowa to give a message about measures we need to take to have a sustainable future in rural Iowa. She also touched on the report given by Brenda Bormann of dialogues that was sent to the Wallace Foundation from the First, the American Dreamer.

Gene Elsbecker gave a report on the meeting of Central Iowa Detention Center and about their adolescent tracking. They only had 1 resident from Kossuth County for about 6 days during April.

Bob Cink reminded the Supervisors that we need a lay person to assign to the NIACOG meetings in Mason City.

Lee Froehlich attended and helped with Ag Day in Emmetsburg with 4th graders throughout the county.

Gary Priebe and Berl Priebe addressed the Supervisors about the proposed sale of the Care Facility to Rabiner Treatment Center and a group of people opposing the sale attended.

Motion by Besch and 2nd by Cink to approve the following resolution:

RESOLUTION ON KOSSUTH COUNTY DRAINAGE DISTRICTS 05-13-03-01

WHEREAS, The Drainage District Board of Trustees are responsible for the maintenance and management of Drainage Districts located within Kossuth County established under Chapter 468 of the Iowa Code.

WHEREAS, Kossuth County Drainage Districts have been established and constructed with the presumption the drainage of surface water from agricultural lands and all other lands, for the protection of such lands from overflow, is conducive to the public health, convenience and welfare.

WHEREAS, certain programs of the State of Iowa and the United States Government have been established to create waterways within the State of Iowa. The creation of these waterways is also conducive to the public health, convenience and welfare.

WHEREAS, some waterways may be located within a Drainage District and the creation of the waterways may potentially compromise the efficiency of the Drainage District improvements.

WHEREAS, a procedure is required to promote the establishment of the waterways and yet protect the improvements of a Drainage District.

WHEREAS, the Drainage District Board of Trustees shall be the exclusive governing body to make the decisions affecting the maintenance and management of Drainage Districts within Kossuth County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, a landowner who proposes to establish a waterway in an area in which Drainage District improvements are located, shall file with the Kossuth County Auditor a Statement of Intent containing the following information:

- 1. The name of the landowner and farm tenant, if any.
- 2. A plat of the waterway identifying any Drainage District improvement within the proposed waterway.
- 3. A report from the engineer who designed the waterway setting forth any proposed manipulation or destruction of drainage district improvements and the resulting effects on existing drainage of lands within the Drainage District.

The plat of the waterway and engineers report will be reviewed by the District's engineer, who shall determine the effect to the District if the waterway is created. The engineer shall consider and address maintenance access, the potential effect upon the ability of the District to make further improvements, the effect upon the ability of the neighboring landowners to connect to the facility, the effect upon drainage capabilities available to all landowners.

The creation of the waterway shall not reduce the coefficient of drainage for any landowner within the Drainage District or reduce cover over existing improvements. The Drainage District shall incur no costs. The cost of these proceedings, including the cost of engineering and legal shall be paid by the landowner or other entity.

The waterway shall retain the classification established by Iowa Code Sections 468.38 through 468.40.

The landowner is responsible to maintain the waterway and all other facilities not assumed by the Drainage District. The Drainage District may enter the property and perform maintenance, repairs or improvements to the Drainage District. If the Trustees deem the maintenance to be an emergency, the District may immediately perform the maintenance.

The landowner's request may be approved upon completion of the above conditions. If the drainage district trustees are convinced the drainage within the Drainage District will not be adversely affected, and the Drainage District will not incur any costs if such approval is given. The drainage district trustees and the

landowners shall enter into an agreement incorporating the conditions contained within this resolution, and any other issues the trustees deem worthy.

Motion by Cink and 2nd by McGregor to approve the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION 05-13-03-02

Whereas, there have been filed with the Kossuth County Board of Supervisors motions by the governing bodies of the following school districts. Algona Community School District, Armstrong-Ringsted Community School District, Corwith-Wesley Community School District, LuVerne Community School District, North Iowa Community School District, North Kossuth Community School District, Sentral Community School District, Titonka Consolidated School District and West Bend – Mallard Community School District;

And, whereas, the above school districts are located within the County and contain a combined total of more than one-half of the population of the County.

And, whereas, the motions request the submission of the question of imposition of a one percent local sales and services tax for school infrastructure at a special election to be held on Tuesday, July 29, 2003.

Now, therefore, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 422E.2, the motions are hereby submitted to the County Commissioner of Elections who is hereby directed to hold an election on Tuesday, July 29, 2003, at which election there shall be submitted to the registered voters of the County the question of imposition of a one percent local sales and services tax for school infrastructure.
